WARRANT ARTICLES Fall Special Town Meeting Saturday, October 15, 2022, 9:00am Historic Old Town Hall

To one of the Constables of the Town of Pelham, in said County.

Greetings:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Pelham, Massachusetts, qualified to vote in the Town affairs to meet in the Pelham Historic Old Town Hall, located at the intersection of Route 202 and Amherst Road in said Pelham on Saturday, the 15th day of October, in the year A.D. 2022 at 9:00 am for the reading of the Town Warrant and to proceed with the meeting. After opening of the meeting, the meeting will move to the Pelham Elementary School, at 45 Amherst Road, Pelham.

Article 1.

To see if the Town will vote to accept MGL c.60, §15B to establish a tax title collection revolving fund, which shall be under the control of the Town Treasurer, which shall be accounted for separately and to which shall be credited any fees, charges and costs collected upon the redemption of tax titles and sales of real property acquired through foreclosure of tax titles; and further to authorize the Town Treasurer to expend from such funds in accordance with the General Laws, provided, however, that said expenditures for such revolving fund shall not exceed the receipts for such fund, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Select Board.

Article 2.

To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of MGL c.90, §17C, which allows the Select Board to establish a speed limit of 25 miles per hour in any thickly settled or business district in the Town that is not a state highway, or take any other action relative thereto.
