VOTED *unanimously* to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Select Board, to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the FY2025 beginning July 1, 2024, in accordance with the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 4, and to issue a note or notes as may be given for a period of less than one year in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 44, Section 17, or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 3. VOTED *unanimously to amend* **Article 3.** Line number 54 Tree Wardens Salary under the Columns Requested and Recommended to read \$1,500 in each. To raise and appropriate, and/or transfer from available funds a sum of money necessary to defray the expenses of the Town for the ensuing fiscal year, or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 6.

VOTED unanimously to amend Article 6. To add the word Used after new. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the Capital Equipment Stabilization Fund the sum of \$40,000 to purchase and equip a new or used medical response vehicle to replace the Fire Department's current medical response vehicle, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Finance Committee and the Select Board.

Article 7.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to appropriate from Free Cash the sum of \$6,850 to purchase and install two solar-powered speed limit signs, including all incidental costs, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Select Board.

Article 8.

VOTED unanimously to see if the Town will vote to approve annual spending limits for FY2025 for revolving funds established in the Town Bylaws, in accordance with G.L c.44, Section 53E1/2, with such expenditure limits to be applicable for each fiscal year until such time as Town Meeting votes, prior to July 1 in any year, to increase the same for the ensuing fiscal year; provided, however, that at the request of the entity authorized to expend such funds, the Select Board, with the approval of the Finance Committee, may increase such limit, for that fiscal year only, all as set forth below, or take any other action relative thereto:

Article 9.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to adopt the recommendation of the Community Preservation Committee to appropriate and transfer the following sum of money from the Community Preservation Fund estimated annual revenues for Community Preservation Committee administrative expenses in FY2025 in the amount of \$8,400, or take any other action relative thereto. *Recommended by the Select Board.*

Article 10.

VOTED *unanimously* To see if the Town will vote to adopt the recommendation of the Community Preservation Committee to appropriate and transfer the following sums of money from the Community Preservation Fund estimated annual revenues, and to reserve for later appropriation: \$17,000.00 for Open Space, \$17,000.00 for Community Housing, and \$17,000.00 for Historic Resources; and to reserve from the estimated annual revenues for later appropriation \$108,600.00 to the annual FY2025 Community Preservation Fund Budgeted Reserve, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Select Board.

Article 11.

VOTED *unanimously to amend Article 11* to see if the Town will vote to amend Section VI of the Amherst Pelham Regional School District Agreement by replacing subsection j) as follows: "For Fiscal Year 2025 only, the alternative operating budget assessment shall be calculated as a five-year average of minimum contributions with the remainder of the assessment allocated to the member towns in accordance with the perpupil method found in Section VI (e) of the Amherst Pelham Regional School District Agreement. Additionally, if any member town's assessment based on this method increases or decreases more than 6% from their Fiscal Year 2024 assessment, the Fiscal Year 2025 assessment shall be limited to a 6% change provided that the requirements of Minimum Local Contribution are still met. The five-year average of minimum contributions will include the five most recent years.", or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 12.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$51,467.28 and transfer and appropriate the sum of \$12,657.72 from Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) Funds for the payment of the Town's (General Fund) indebtedness, or take any other action relative thereto. *Recommended by the Select Board.*

Article 13.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,774 from the PEG Access and Cable Related Fund (established by vote of the Fall 2015 Town Meeting) to be used by the Select Board for the purpose of Technology services and purchases for the Town, or take any other action relative thereto. *Recommended by the Select Board.*

Article 14.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken under Article 17 of the May 13, 2023 Annual Town Meeting establishing an Opioid Settlement Stabilization Fund in accordance with G.L. c. 40, Section 5B, and to transfer the current balance of said Opioid Settlement Stabilization Fund in the amount of \$12,219.58, and direct any further opioid settlement funds received in the future, into the Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund, or take any other action relative thereto. *Recommended by the Select Board.*

Article 15.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$8,278.74 from Free Cash to the MVP State Grant balance, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Finance Committee and the Select Board.

Article 16.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to approve the plan, developed by the Town of Pelham Select Board in partnership with the Town of Amherst and City of Northampton, for an inter-municipal Community Choice Energy organization, pursuant to General Laws Chapter 164, Section 134, and the vote taken under Article 46 of the May 12, 2018 Annual Town Meeting, or take any other action relative thereto. *Recommended by the Select Board.*

Article 17.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Library Trustees to expend such monies as they may receive from the sale of discarded books, gifts, and bequests, and from the State and Federal Governments, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Select Board.

Article 18.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Pelham Cultural Council to expend such monies as it may receive from the State and Federal Governments, and from gifts and bequests, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Select Board.

Article 19.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to enter into contracts with the Massachusetts Highway Department for construction and/or maintenance of public highways for Fiscal Year 2025, and further to authorize the Select Board on behalf of the Town to accept and expend any money from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for highway construction and/or maintenance, provided that no funds shall be expended to widen, or enter into a contract to widen, any Town road unless the Select Board has held a public hearing advertised at least fourteen (14) days in advance, with any proposed contract and/or plans for such road improvements being posted for public viewing prior to the public hearing, and further provided that such policy is consistent with State requirements, or take any other action relative thereto. *Recommended by the Select Board*.

Article 20.

VOTED *unanimously* to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to accept and/or apply for any State or Federal funds or grants that may become available during Fiscal Year 2025 and to expend such funds in accordance with the terms and conditions thereof, provided that no funds shall be expended to widen, or to enter into a contract to widen, any Town road unless the Select Board has held a public hearing advertised at least fourteen (14) days in advance, with any proposed contract and/or plans for such road improvements being posted for public viewing prior to the public hearing, and further provided that such policy is consistent with State requirements, or take any other action relative thereto.

Recommended by the Select Board.

The business of the warrant having been completed, the meeting voted to dissolve at 12:03 p.m. on Saturday, May 14, 2024. 83 voters were checked in.
